 Emotions	<p>In my choice of clothes I would feel: Happy, Comfortable, Powerful, Control, Empowered, Vibrant</p> <p>In a uniform I would feel: Oppressed, Weak, Uncomfortable, Controlled, Powerless, Boring</p>
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 Thoughts	<p>"I want my clothes to express who I am."</p> <p>"If I was forced to wear a uniform my mind would be focused on how unfair it is, instead of school"</p>

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 Figurative Language	<p>Uniforms: as dull as a cardboard box Personality killer, freedom stealer</p> <p>Choice: a rainbow of style,</p>
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 Rhetorical Questions	<p>"Shouldn't kids be free to express themselves?"</p> <p>"If you could enter a room with a rainbow of colors, would you really choose a room of beige?"</p> <p>"Shouldn't freedom of expression be a right for all Americans, even children?"</p>
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 Actions	<p>Clothing choice: stand up, fight, express, comfort, please, encourage, inspire, trust, empower</p> <p>Uniforms: weaken, bore, sadden</p>
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 Math	<p>100% of kids I know would prefer to have a choice in their clothing</p> <p>3/4 (three out of four) parents want their kids to be empowered and love them for the individuals they are.</p>
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 Examples	<p>Even Dr. Seuss wrote about how uniforms would make kids sad when he described the difference between Diffendoofer school and "Dreary Flobbertown" in his book <u>Hootay for Diffendoofer Day</u>.</p> <p>When we learned about the Bill of Rights, I really felt good to be an American citizen. If I am forced to wear a uniform I would feel like I am not valued as an American. Having choices makes me feel empowered and trusted.</p>
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
